



SHSP OUTREACH




- Six outreach events were held across the State



HIGHWAY SAFETY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (HSIP)



- FAST Act
 - Continues the HSIP as a core Federal Aid program to significantly <u>reduce</u> fatalities and serious injuries on all public roads.
 - State HSIP Program
 - Safety improvement projects on the State Highway System
 - Local HSIP Program
 - Safety Improvement Projects (Benefit/Cost selected safety projects)
 - (New) Systemic Safety Analysis Report Program (SSARP)



 10 years of fatal and serious injury collisions - 2008 to 2017


 Data analysis drives implementation

 Annual review of data during implementation






Total Fatal and Serious Injury Collisions by Year






Fatal and Serious Injury Collisions vs. VMT






Fatal and Serious Injury Collisions vs. Population






Statewide Fatal and Serious Injury Rates (2008-2017)






Fatal & Serious Injury Victims by Age











F+SI Collisions by Day of Week






Fatal and Serious Injury Collisions by Time of Day






State Highway System (SHS)






Rural vs. Urban




Percent of Victims by Location






F+SI Collisions by County

Strategic Action Development



- Developed by Challenge Area Teams reviewed and approved by Steering Committee
- Action Guidance
 - Be SMART
 - Specific clear action statement
 - Measurable identified performance measures
 - Achievable committed resources by responsible organization
 - Relevant data-driven identification of issue
 - Time Constrained achievable within SHSP timeframe
